Biographies of the Panelists

WATANABE Mayu

President, the Global Forum of Japan

Graduated from Chiba University. Received M.A. in Education from the Graduate School of the University of Tokyo in 1997. Joined the Japan Forum on International Relations (JFIR) in 2000 and appointed to Senior Research Fellow in 2007, during which period she specialized in global human resource development and public diplomacy. Appointed to Executive Director in 2011 and assumed the current position since 2017. Concurrently serving as Senior Executive Director of the IFIR, and Acting Vice-President of the Council on East Asian Community (CEAC).

<u>Pascal BONIFACE</u>

Director, the French Institute for International and Strategic Affairs

Concurrently serves as Professor of International Relations at the "Institut d'Etudes européennes (Institute for European Studies)," the University of Paris VIII. Previously published or edited more than sixty books that deal with International Relations, European security, French international policy, and also the conflict in the Middle-East and its impact in France. His recent publication includes "La géopolitique" and "50 idées reçues sur l'état du monde".'

WATANAEBE Hirotaka

Professor, Tokyo University of Foreign Studies

Graduated from Tokyo University of Foreign Studies in 1978. Received M. A. from Tokyo University of Foreign Studies in 1980. Completed his doctoral studies in international relations at the Universite de Paris I Pantheon-Sorbonne in 1986. Occupied such positions as Assistant Professor, and then Professor of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies. Also served as a Minister, Public Diplomacy at Japanese Embassy in France (2008-2010) and Editor in Chief, "Gaiko(Diplomacy)" and "Cahier du Japon" (2002-2012). Concurrently serves as Director, Institute of International Relations at Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, Editor in chief, French edition of "nippon.com."

TAKAHATA Yohei

Vice President, the Global Forum of Japan

Graduated from Hosei University in 2007. Received M.A. in International Relations from the Graduate School of Waseda University in 2009 and joined the Japan Forum on International Relations (JFIR) and the Global Forum of Japan (GFJ). Appointed to Executive Secretary, GFJ in 2015 and assumed the current position since 2018. Concurrently serving as Senior Research Fellow, JFIR, e-Forum Chief Editor and Academic Member, GFJ. The field of his expertise includes IR and the politics of Antarctica.

HIROSE Yoko

Professor, Keio University

Graduated in Policy Management from Keio University, received M.A. in Laws from the University of Tokyo and obtained Ph.D. in Media and Governance from Keio University. Occupied such positions as Special Researcher at Slavic Research Center of Hokkaido University and Visiting Scholar at Harriman Institute, Columbia University (2013-2014). Currently serves as Visiting Reseacher at the Aleksanteri Institute, University of Helsinki in Finland.

Daniyar KOSNAZAROV Head, Strategic Analysis Department of Narxoz University (Khazakstan)

Graduated in International Relations from Selcuk University in Turkey, received M.A. in International Relations and Regional Studies from the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Tsukuba University. Occupied such positions as Deputy Director at Eurasian Research Institute (2013-2014) and Senior Research Fellow at International Turkic Academy (2015-2016). His articles were published at the Financial Times, the Diplomat, Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, RUSI.

MIFUNE Emi

Professor, Komazawa University

Graduated from Waseda University, received M.A. in International Relations from the Graduate School of Boston University and completed Ph.D. in Politics at Gakushuin University. The field of her expertise are contemporary Chinese diplomacy international relations studies.

<u>YANO Takuya</u>

Research Coordinator, the Japan Forum on International Relations

Graduated from Keio University, obtained Master of Law from the Graduate School of Law at Keio University, where he also completed Ph.D. coursework in Political Science. Joined JFIR in 2007 and served as Research Assistant, Research Fellow, Senior Research Fellow in 2009 before assuming the current position since 2015. Co-authored "Intersections of the History of Political Though and Intellectual History in Europe" (Keio University Press, 2008) and "East Asian Community White Paper 2010" (Tachibana Shuppan, 2010), etc.

Professor, Hokkaido University

Graduated from the University of Tokyo, from which he also received M.A and Ph.D in Area Studies. Previously occupied such positions as Attaché at the Embassy of Japan in the Republic of Kazakhstan (1994-1995) and Visiting Scholar at the Institute of Oriental Studies, the National Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Kazakhstan (1995-1996). He specializes in Central Eurasian history and politics, with research interests ranging from Russian imperial history and national movements to contemporary authoritarian regimes and international relations.

<u>Scott SEAMAN</u>

Director, Asia, Eurasia Group (U.S.A.)

Received B.A. in Government from the University of Virginia and M.A. and Ph.D. in political science from Duke University. Previously worked at MetLife as Assistant Vice President with responsibilities for government relations in Asian markets. Also served in the US Commerce Department's International Trade Administration. Scott focuses at Eurasia Group on the economic, trade, and foreign policies of Japan, South Korea, and North Korea.

SUZUKI Yoshikatsu

Journalist / former Editor in Chief, "Diplomacy"

Graduated from Waseda University. He is one of the leading journalists in Japan, who had long held a position at Political Division of Jiji Press serving as both Senior Correspondent of the Washington Bureau and Head of the New York Bureau, branches of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and The Prime Minister's Official Residence. Now he serves as Senior Research Fellow of Foreign Service Training Institute. His recent publication includes "Japan's Strategic Diplomacy (日本の戦略 外交)."

KAWAI Masahiro

Specially Appointed Professor, The University of Tokyo

Graduated in Economics from the University of Tokyo and received M.S. in Statistics and Ph.D in Economics from Stanford University. Previously served as: Associate Professor of Economics at The Johns Hopkins University; Professor of Economics at the University of Tokyo; Chief Economist of the World Bank's East Asia and Pacific Region; Deputy Vice Minister of Finance for International Affairs of Japan's Finance Ministry; and Dean of Asian Development Bank Institute. Now he concurrently serves as Superior Research Fellow of JFIR and Academic Member of GFJ.

(2) The Japan Forum on International Relations (JFIR)

JFIR is a membership organization with four categories of membership: namely, (1) corporate, (2) associate corporate, and (3) individual. As for the organizational structure of JFIR, the "Board of Trustees" is the highest decision-making body, which is in charge of electing the "Directors" and of supervising overall activities of JFIR, etc., while the "Board of Directors" is an executive body, which is in charge of the management of day-to-day operations of JFIR. There are, in addition, four "Committees," which function either under the direction or at the request of the Board of Directors for the implementation of the activities of JFIR. "Advisors" serve "Chairman," while "Counselors" serve "President" both as their consultants. The activities of JFIR are categorized into the following seven pillars: (1) Policy Recommendations, (2) On-




